# scor3card

*The triple bottom line strategy*

## **SCOR3CARD®**

Scor3card® is an online sustainability tracking and assessment tool for organizations who want to track and improve their sustainability plans. Using the triple bottom line strategy, Scor3card engages organizations around three areas of sustainability: people, profit, planet. This holistic approach to sustainability allows organizations to engage their employees, bolster their economic growth, and become better environmental stewards.

The 42 Scor3card members for the 2020-2021 cycle were able to save over \$277,852 in Scor3card 2020-2021 through waste reduction and efficiency programs, bringing Scor3card participants' collective savings to over \$7,500,000 since the program began in 2016. In addition to saving money, Scor3card participants were able to offset 27,874 metric tons of CO2 and recycle almost 29,000 tons of waste. On top of the waste education and savings, Scor3card members donated \$18,216,697 toward sponsorships and community initiatives; and Scor3card members' employees donated 88,947 volunteer hours (up from 11,456 volunteer hours the preceding cycle). During the 2020-2021 cycle, 7,600 employees participated in Scor3card members' workplace wellness programs.



## Henry Bellmon Sustainability Awards

In 2010, Sustainable Tulsa and Southside Rotary of Tulsa formed the Henry Bellmon Awards, named after one of Oklahoma’s most respected statesmen and an early champion of sustainability in Oklahoma. In 2018, Southside Rotary of Tulsa graciously passed the baton in order for Sustainable Tulsa to continue the awards through our Scor3card program.

In 2021 we hosted our annual fundraising event on Thursday, September 23, 2021 featuring special keynote speaker, *National Geographic* photographer Joel Sartore. With safety at the forefront of our minds and to move forward with a sustainable event, our **RECHARGE** fundraiser was virtually again this year.

## **2021 RECHARGE KEYNOTE PRESENTER JOEL SARTORE**

Joel Sartore is a photographer, speaker, author, teacher, conservationist, National Geographic Fellow, and a regular contributor to *National Geographic Magazine*. His hallmarks are a sense of humor and a Midwestern work ethic.

Joel specializes in documenting endangered species and landscapes in order to show a world worth saving. He is the founder of **The Photo Ark**, a multi-year documentary project to save species and habitat.

In his words, “It is folly to think that we can destroy one species and ecosystem after another and not affect humanity. When we save species, we’re actually saving ourselves.” Joel has written several books including *RARE: Portraits of America’s Endangered Species*, *Photographing Your Family*, *Nebraska: Under a Big Red Sky*, and *Let’s Be Reasonable*. His most recent book, *The Photo Ark* is now available wherever books are sold.
